#### MICHAEL'S STORY

## "They took me right in . . . and taught me about the Lord." —Michael

In Michael's experience, a life lived on the streets only finished one of two ways: "It ends with incarceration," he shook his head. "Or maybe even death."

That's the hard truth he found himself facing after years of hurt, addiction and homelessness. At the end of his road, "I had nowhere to go... I was at the bottom of the bottom of the bottom" he says. And nobody left to look to for help—or hope. "I didn't know what to do so I just wanted to die."

Until one day, "some people were telling me about the Springfield Rescue Mission," he says. "They told me it could help *me*."

Hungry and afraid, he found himself at our door. "I had breakfast at 7:00 AM," he recalls. "I talked with them here, they took me right in . . . and taught me all about the Lord."

Michael marvels at all he's found at the Rescue Mission that saved him from the streets—and



helped him turn his life around: "I had nowhere to go. But, the Rescue Mission provided meals for me—and a bed, showers, and a place to stay when I was down and out . . .

"But," he smiles, "what I didn't know was how it was going to help me build a relationship with God, and that's the most beautiful thing about Springfield Rescue Mission. Food, shelter, clothing—and getting in touch with God!"

That, of course, is the core of our proven Men's New Life Rehabilitation Program, and Michael is a faithful follower of Christ. "I'm building a relationship with Him on a regular basis," he nods. "And it's a work in progress: I'm not where I want to be, but I'm where I need to be right now!"

He's also the first to share that Christ-centered point of view with others coming here for help and hope. "I've grown to a point where I have a better understanding about Christ. I pray, and I read the Word of God on a daily basis, participating in a relationship with Him. I also found out what a relationship requires, too," he beams. "So, that's what I'm doing—and it's a wonderful thing!"


With your generous help – from Taylor Street to Mill Street – nearly **50 beds** were occupied every night of the year.



# "I can't thank you enough—all the time!" —Steve

"COVID-19 played a big part in me becoming homeless," Steve sighs, looking back at how the pandemic swept through his life, like so many others in Greater Springfield.

"I was an alcoholic, pretty much since my early '20s," he admits. "But, I'd been sober for 29 years—had a house and everything." But after a car accident, he fell into opioids—and coming out of that, back into alcohol.

And when the pressures of the pandemic pushed him further into his downward spiral, he lost his marriage and his home. The pain still fresh in his eyes, Steve says, "I ended up being on the street for quite a while—and now, when you're out there in this COVID-19 situation, you're not welcome anymore."



Finally, Steve found his way to our door—literally, falling asleep there one dark early morning. He was woken by one of our staff and invited inside for a meal, a bed—and, after a short while, "He invited me into the total

program here," Steve nods. "And it worked out fantastically!"

Full of enthusiasm for his second chance, Steve says, "I totally absorbed the Word and everything about what's going on here—going to classes that brought structure to my life that I didn't have before . . . this place is wonderful."

And we were only able to care for Steve in this way because of friends like you who are involved in this ministry.

"I've met so many wonderful people, you know what I mean?" he says gratefully. "Really, honestly, the nicest people I've ever met in my life. I can't thank you enough—all the time!"
