The Springfield Rescue Mission provides food, shelter, clothing and Christian rehabilitation, free of charge, through our Emergency and Rehabilitation Programs for men, women and children.

- 2,544,809 pounds of food donated to SRM
- 185,087 pounds of clothing donated to SRM
- 85,087 pounds of hygiene items donated to SRM
- 18,002 Volunteer hour donated saving SRM \$539,160
