

He tried various shelters, but they all seemed to be uncomfortable, disturbing or dangerous.


Finally, he came to Springfield Rescue Mission where he received a warm welcome, a safe place to sleep, nutritious meals and hope for the future.

# TWO MEALS A WEEK This Thanksgiving will be better!

hristmas in jail, New Year's sleeping under a bridge.

Matt spent 15 years addicted, wandering in and out of unemployment, prison and homelessness. Pain came early. His father was abusive, and Matt's parents divorced. His mother married a man who didn't like Matt.

He was still just a teen when his mother put him on the street with nothing but a bag of clothes. Matt remembers those years as a litany of grief: "addictions, depression, anxiety, isolation and loneliness, abandonment."

Sometimes he could manage. He could get a job, keep it for a while. But then the old despair would creep in, or a problem at work

would waylay him, and he would turn back to drugs—lose his job—lose his home—lose himself. Eventually, he grew "kind of numb," he says, "where I felt like almost nothing I could do could get me out of this situation."

For a time, he had a tent; but the winter cold was agony. Hunger was a constant tormentor. Matt sometimes went days without a meal. When he found a camp that served two free meals a week, he considered himself lucky.

Matt was ready to respond to God's provision for his physical *and* spiritual hunger. A social worker guided him to Springfield Rescue Mission.

Here, Matt surrendered his life to Jesus Christ, and what followed was an astonishing transformation. "I really started growing in my faith," he says, delighted to "have Jesus as my rock!"

Matt is also thrilled to be part of the family of God. "For the longest time, I tried to kind of stay to myself and not bother anyone," he recalls. "So I'm grateful for any time someone reaches out with a helping hand. . . . It's really touched my heart."

Today, Matt is looking to the future. By God's grace, your giving helped point him in this new direction. Thank you for praying, thank you for giving, thank you for your sacrifice of love. You truly do make a difference—for now, and for eternity!
